


Mary

### **Christmas Presents for Your Pet**



As pet owners, we all like to have special little gifts under the tree for our special dog or cat. What about giving them something that can really impact the quality of their life?

#### Micro-chips

Micro-chipping has helped to reunite many pets with their owners. A simple microchip is implanted under the skin of your pet which is unique to only your pet. If your pet is separated from you and is found by someone else, scanning your pet can link them back to their owner. All dogs are micro-chipped before adopting from the shelter; check with your vet if your current pet is not micro-chipped.

#### Collars & ID Tags

### Dental Cleaning

Keeping their teeth clean helps to keep them healthy as well.

Even the friendliest most loving pet has the potential to injure when scared, threatened or when overly excited. And there is a lot of excitement during the holidays. So here are a few tips when you bring that new Christmas Kitten or Puppy home for the kids:

- •Know about the breed of dog/cat before you get one; know if it does well in an apartment or needs more space; is it a high energy or low energy pet; does it require a lot of activity or will it be happy as a couch potato? Your lifestyle has a lot to do with the type of pet you should get.
- •Supervise your children and pets; never leave a young child/toddler or infant alone with an animal.
- Teach pet responsibility children can be responsible for feeding and watering, under the guidance of a parent; also teaches the pet to respect them as a caregiver.
- Have enough pet toys available and keep them separate from children's toys.
- Teach children to not awaken a sleeping pet or bother a pet when its eating.
- Never take a toy or treat from an animals mouth.
- •Don't play rough games like tug of war or wrestling, which can over-stimulate an animal.
- Teach children to not hug or grab at ears and tails; most animals do not like that kind of contact, especially in the beginning when becoming adjusted to their new home environment and family.

Pets provide much companionship and love within the home, teach your child respect and how to treat animals, and enjoy your new addition to the family.
